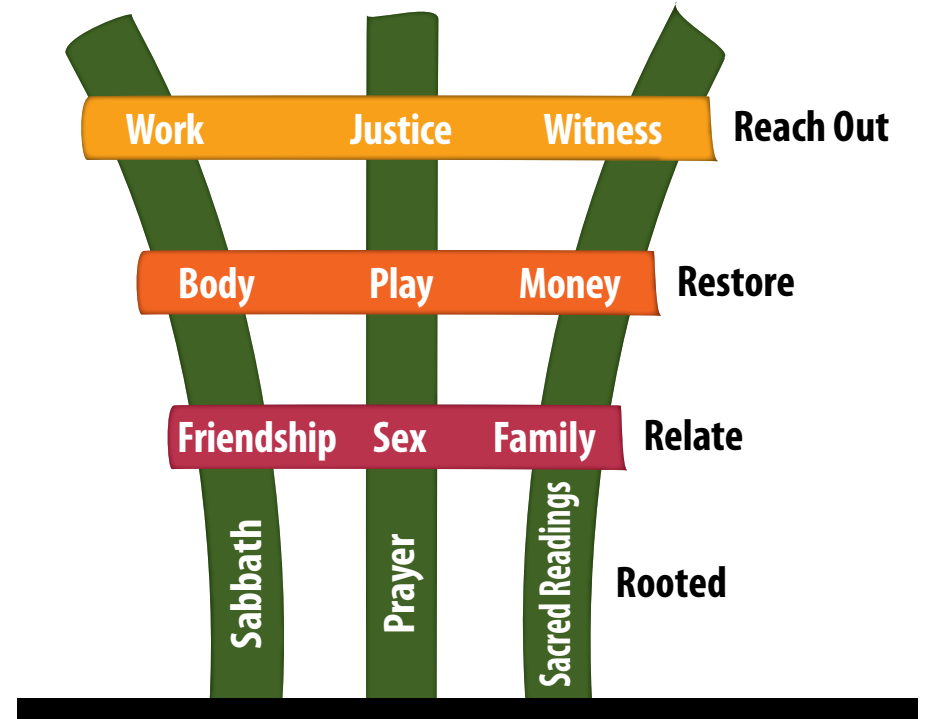
3. Witness

Study Questions

1. Do you see yourself co-creating with God in your work? If so, how?
2. How can your rhythm of prayer make you more conscious of God as you work at your company, school, or home?
3. How does offering our work to God shape the quality of our work?
4. Why is prayer so central to our work for God? In what sense is prayer the work? How does Jesus model dependence on God through prayer during his ministry?
5. Have you ever had a vision for a work of God rising in your heart? What was it? How did you respond?
6. Do you have a sense as to what “one thing” you might commit yourself to?”
7. “How can this knowledge of God’s prevenient grace free us from fear or insecurity as we bear witness to the reality of God?”
8. Even Billy Graham describes feeling a twinge of fear whenever a conversation with a friend who is not a believer turns to spiritual matters. Have you ever felt awkwardness (or pushback) when sharing your faith with someone else? If so, how did you deal with the awkwardness?
