MINISTRY REVIEW & FORECAST

Board Chair Report (Caitlin Dawe) - 2020/2021

- The Board has seen and heard how hard the staff and volunteers have worked at learning new ways to bring the church services to us in our homes every week and to help us stay connected. For all they've done, the Board would like to publicly thank them. We see you and we Thank You.
- Dave has been right there leading and learning and looking forward to what the future holds in the midst of this pandemic while also encountering some significant staffing changes within the church. The Board would like to acknowledge all that he has done this year in hopes that the summer can bring rest and recuperation for both the staff and the lead Pastor of our church.
- The majority of Board meetings this year took place over ZOOM and, as you can imagine, Covid-19 dominated our discussions in terms of how church was being held, that people were being connected with and loved, as well as important discussions around church finances.

• Teaching & Global: Dave Morehouse

I'm responsible for leading, teaching, and the vision and direction of the church. There were 20 youth out each week throughout the year as well as being involved within The Journey Church through Shine, NGL, Youth Band and serving in the Sunday services. We are excited for UNDERCURRENT coming up July 8-10; we're hoping for 20 youth to join us!

• Administration & Communications: Lisa McKim, Giving and Financial Administrator

SPENDING PLAN PRESENTATION

Susan

General Fund: \$544,000

Missions Fund: \$43,000, the missions fund increased by 44% this year

LEAD: \$56,000

Total Giving: \$709,000, a 6% increase over last year

Expenditure Highlights

\$66,500 went to Missions which included missions, community care and Easter

\$34,000 worth of upgrades at the AC included the stage, carpet, and painting

We started the year with a surplus of \$19,000 and we ended with a deficit position of \$1000.

We currently have \$34,000 at the Baptist Foundation in the savings account.

AC mortgage of \$57,000/finishes April 2023 and a BC mortgage of \$77,000/finishes June 2024

Lisa

Financial fun facts:

We have 215 giving units, i.e., a couple or single person gave an average of 63\$/week. The top 20% of the giving units gave 60% of the overall giving so that is an average of \$85/week. 50% of our overall weekly giving is recurring, auto-giving and that is helpful for us. We'd really like to see that go up to 60% in the next ministry year.

Linda

The SPENDING PLAN for 2021-2022 documents can be found on our website.

For our General Fund we are projecting a little bit over what actually came in this past year for a total giving of \$713,000. We are being conservative in our faith step going into this new fiscal year.

And here's why: We had a strange 4th Quarter where we had projected \$143,000 to come in to our General Fund, and we only actually received \$129,500. So that's about \$13,500 less than we had anticipated. We had very low giving early in May, and strong giving weeks last week of May and

first week of June, but then it dropped down again, and considerably lower than it has been. We still are not sure what's going on, but this is why we decided to be cautious in our projections.

Heading into the 4th Quarter, we were actually up \$14,000 in our giving. So this explains the deficit side of where we ended last year and why we went lower with our faith step going into this fiscal year.

Motion

We move to adopt the Giving and Spending Plan for The Journey Church. Moved by Linda Hisey, seconded by Cathy Simon, approved.

Question:

Do we have a plan to be able to pay our Next Generational pastoral staff out of our general fund?

Answer:

For this year, our plan is to look for a transitional person to help with our youth and young adults for the fall, winter and spring. We don't have someone fulltime in our budget, but we do have in the budget money for that part-time position @ 20hrs/weekly. Also our LEAD campaign is still playing a role in this NexGen staff position.

The Road to Recovery: Pastor Dave Morehouse

First of all, thank you all for joining us in the Zoom AGM 2021. One way we love each other is, we show up for each other.

As we think about the Road to Recovery, we recognize that as we go forward, it's not about going back, it's about moving forward. And as we do this, we must ask ourselves, what it means to be a Christian church in a Canadian Society in 2021. We know we are entering a new era of "times of uncertainty" as we ask ourselves, what does it mean to engage people in faith, what does it mean to truly be a light in this world.

We are in such a different time and as we move forward, we have to be wrestling with many questions. The digital campus is one of those questions that is going to be a big risk for us, it's going to be disruptive. We're asking the Brentwood family to make a sacrifice for the mission of the church. We hope that God will bless you as you are willing to make that sacrifice along with the rest of us as we sacrifice our time to serve, and to give financially on a regular basis so that it creates stability for the life of my church family.

I go back to our series this past year, "Hanging onto Love," Paul says, "The whole law can be summed up in Galations 5:14, "Love your neighbor as yourself." The one thing that will anchor us together is if we love our neighbor as ourselves.
