Philippians 2:13

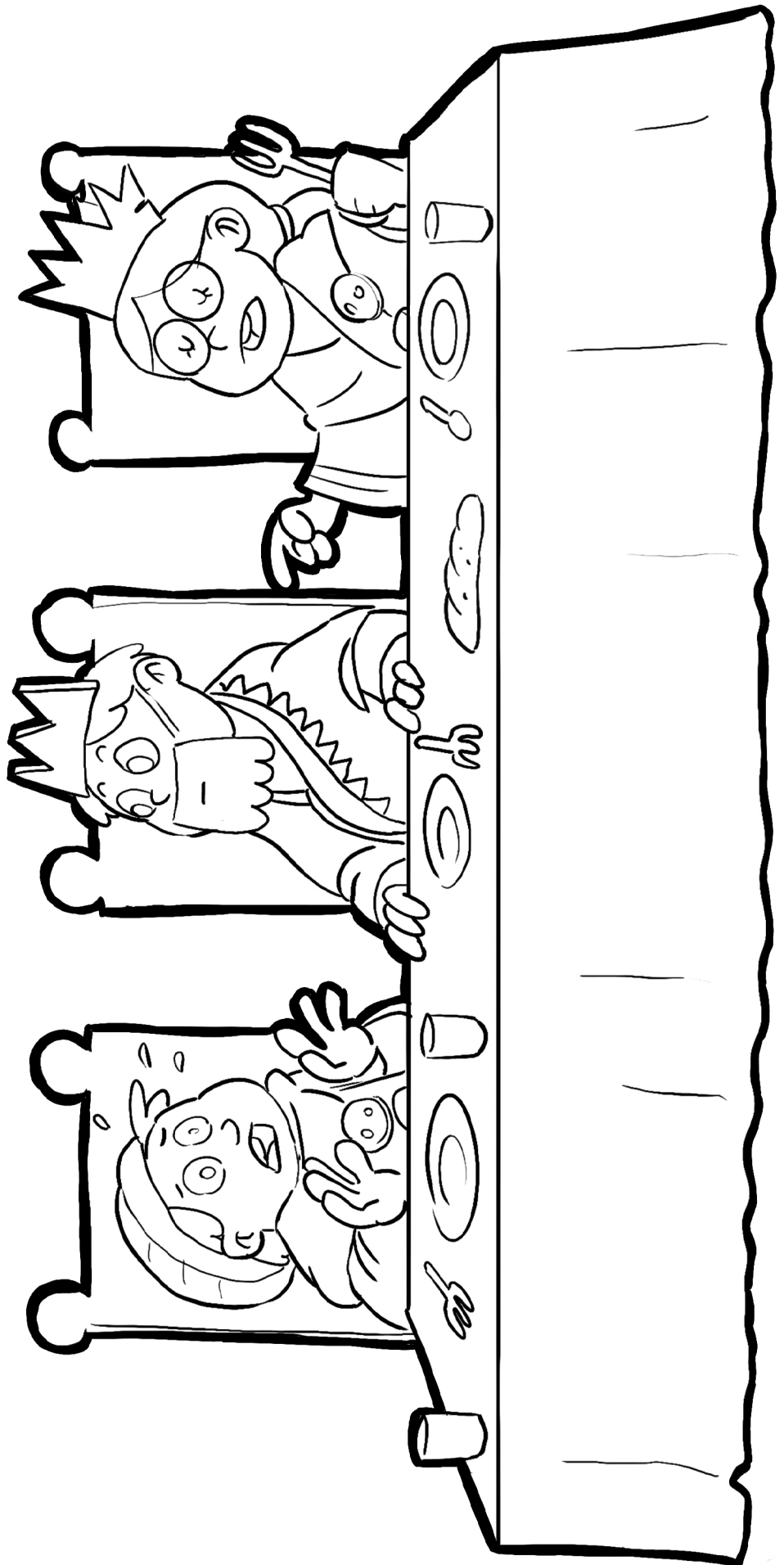

Next week, we start a new series called, City of Angels, where we hear the story of Christmas!

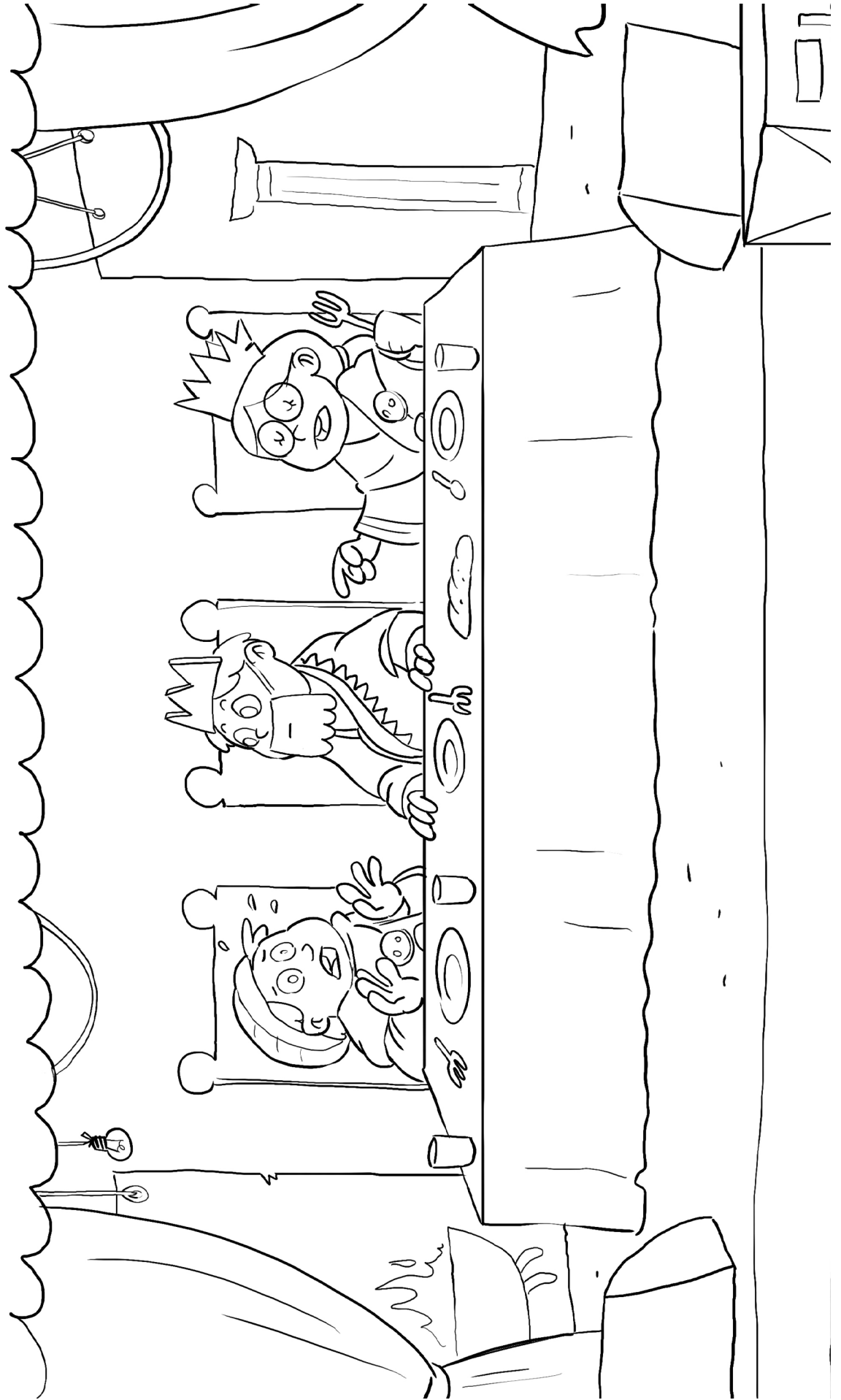
