## **MINISTRY REVIEW & FORECAST**

Board Chair Report, Kim Ayles

- The year passed quickly!
- At this meeting last year, we talked about the "what ifs," passing a partial-year budget and not knowing how the lead pastor search process would unfold. We trusted God for His plan and purpose!
- September brought us an amazing transition team.
- October saw Pastor Dave's final Sunday and a gala celebration for his 37 years of ministry, along with the congregation's generous endowment of a scholarship at Crandall to honour his legacy and commitment to next generations leadership.
- In November, the Search team had a candidate!

- Pastor Carolyn was flown in for leadership interviews in December and in February to meet the congregation. The church extended an invitation for her to serve as our next lead pastor!
- We are thankful for the way God continues to move even now.
- Kim read from Philippians 2, on the theme of working together with one mind and purpose.

- Journey Kids Clubs was fully led by Lydia McArthur this ministry this year; we had the most consistent participation this year!
- Lead Mission Team, 2023 Trip to Guatemala

Julianna Hisey, Pastoral Intern, Youth & Young Adults, and Equipping Ministry

- Nothing in youth and young adults would have been possible this year without Aiden Hatchard.
- 5 Youth went to Tidal Impact
- Young adults retreat; intentional time was spent in both solitude and community.
- 8 new Youth Leaders joined our team this year!
- During the recent OneCon event at the Coliseum, our youth spent some of their free time picking up trash around the building.
- Young adults met consistently this year, working through the *Practicing the Way* series.
- Good Friday: every element of the service was planned and completed by our Next Gen Leaders group (NGL).
- NGL also led the 30-Hour Famine, raising almost \$10,000, the highest amount in Canada.
- Equipping ministries: to help people learn about opportunities for service, we developed a page on our website.

Todd Hisey, Creative and Technical Director

- This time last year, we were anxious due to having just lost several key members from the teams to family moves, significantly affecting our scheduling.
- Darrell Nevers and Joy Grant stepped up and have played significant roles in their part-time positions.

- It really is thanks to Darrell that we have online services and recently he was also asked to return to the stage to lead worship during services. He is always willing to serve wherever he is most needed on any given Sunday.
- We have up to 18 people involved in worship teams or tech every weekend (12/AC, 6/RC), and could use a couple more at each campus.
- We've added team members this past year, but are still not close to full.
- We are looking forward to giving the teams a bit of a rest over the summer.

Jarvis Lepper, Pastor of Care and Community

- Care takes all kinds of forms here at TJC, including the church family meal, journey groups, men's breakfast.
- One recent success was the All Things Seniors event, at which we had 96 people, 75% of which were not connected to TJC. Susan E. Steeves helped provide leadership for this event.
- Pastor Jarvis was recently part of a conversation at Crandall about how to connect with some of the 700 international students there, as well as other newcomers in the city.
- Our refugee sponsorship group, Partners of Hope, had 3 families come to Canada with the help of The Journey Church's co-sponsorship.
- Our monthly community care offering has continued to support community parters, such as local high schools, Harvest House, and Teen Challenge (among others).
- Romans 12:10: "Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves."

Dean Patterson, Facilities

- New LED lights installed at the Riverview campus, 25% of the cost covered by an NB Power rebate.
- Replaced some decaying siding at the Allison campus, and replaced the entry door by the office.
- Facility Booster Team includes approximately 25 people who have stepped up to help with painting, cleaning, and construction projects at both campuses.
- Custodial staff are doing an amazing job keeping our campuses clean.

## **BOARD NOMINATION**

Keith shared the process that the Board follows before presenting candidates to the congregation for affirmation: Gay Crossman, Dave McComiskey, and Susan E. Steeves.

Currently, the Board is smaller than in previous years (an intentional decision during the transition period). After serving 7- and 8-years terms, consecutively, Kevin Steeves and Kim Ayles are rotating off.

The Board proposes three Board candidates for the congregation to affirm, to bring our Board to 6 members (including Pastor Carolyn). We anticipate that by this fall we will propose at least one more candidate, to bring the Board to a full complement of 7 members. (In the meantime, the Chair of the Board will not vote at its meetings. Since the Board normally operates by consensus, this is not expected to raise any problems.)
